## Information for treatment under local anaesthetic and intravenous sedation.

You have been referred by your own dentist to have a tooth/teeth removed under local anaesthetic supplemented with IV sedation due to (please tick)-

- 1. Anxiety/phobia
- 2. Complex treatment
- 3. Gag reflex
- 4. Other

Other treatment options have been discussed-

- 1. No treatment
- 2. Treatment under local anaesthetic only
- 3. Inhalation sedation
- 4. General anaesthetic
- 5. Other e.g. hypnosis

IV sedation is a technique whereby Midazolam (a benzodiazepine similar to valium) is administered into a vein (usually hand or arm) via a cannula until a state of relaxation is achieved.

Important points to note-

- 1. You will not be rendered unconscious
- 2. Communication is required throughout treatment
- 3. Co-operation is required during treatment

4. You may/may not have partial/complete memory loss
5. It is NOT a general anaesthetic
Common occurrences-
1. Bruising/swelling at site of cannulation
2. Variation of state of sedation
Rare occurrences-
1. Infection at the site of cannulation
2. Failure of sedation to work- documented at 1-2%
